Minutes Clay County Children's Service Fund Board Meeting March 20, 2024

Roll Call

John McGovern then called the roll. Deb Hermann was excused. All other members of the board were present.

Approve/Amend Agenda Items

The board reviewed the agenda for the March 20, 2024 meeting. Pastor Robert Franseen moved to approve the agenda. Rick Jones seconded the motion and the board voted in favor 8-0.

Visitor Introductions

Ken Honeck welcomed in-person and virtual visitors to the meeting.

Approval of Minutes

Nic Riesenberg made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 21, 2024 meeting. John McGovern seconded the motion and the board voted in favor 8-0.

Finance Report

Bruce Culley gave an overview of the financial report for February 2024. The total fund balance as of February 29, 2024 was \$11,825,450.28 with \$12,127,571.42 in total grants committed. Revenue in February 2024 totaled \$1,192,093.47 and expenses totaled \$1,744,436.76 for a total net operating revenue in February 2024 of (\$552,343.29). Sales tax revenue in February 2024 totaled \$1,147,626.29, a 15.61% increase compared to February 2023. With a motion by John McGovern and a second by Pastor Robert Franseen, the board voted to approve the financial report as presented 8-0.

Executive Director's Report

Ms. Macken shared that the agency service audit report draft was reviewed and CommCare is in the process of completing revisions. The final payment will be processed once revisions are complete. The board also expressed an interest in reviewing the agency audit process to improve efficiency.

Kathy Macken then shared that the School-Based Services application closed and she will continue reviewing applications until April 5. The Programs Committee will have its first meeting to review applications on April 29 at 5 p.m. Applications will be provided to the committee electronically, with hard copies available upon request.

Ms. Macken also shared that the Community-Based Services application will open on April 1 and close on April 26.

Then, she presented the following approved budget revisions:

- Feed Northland Kids reallocated \$7,000 to support community food kits.
- MOCSA reallocated \$4,319.16 within salaries due to a position vacancy.
- Excelsior Springs School District reallocated \$9,000 to support their People of All Color Succeed (POAC) program.
- Kearney School District reallocated \$20,000 to support play therapy and their Stop Sex Trafficking program.
- Smithville School District reallocated \$2,000 to support their middle school Hope Squad program.

Finally, Ms. Macken provided updates from other Missouri Children's Services Funds. She also shared that an Early Childhood Fund is in the early stages of development, with statutes being drafted. However, to make any changes to the CSF statute, there would need to be a public vote.

Ken Honeck shared that the Strategic Planning Committee is moving forward after reviewing survey results, and they are currently finding ways to incorporate feedback.

The Family Conservancy - Childhood Mental Health Presentation

The board invited Jocelyn Mourning and Cassandra Bremehr from The Family Conservancy to present on the organization's programs. Highlights included serving 3,865 Clay County children in prevention services and 35 Clay County children with play therapy in 2023. They also shared their approach to services, which is building a foundation of safety and connection and then assisting with self-regulation, executive functioning, and resilience. Following the presentation, Jocelyn Mourning and Cassandra Bremehr answered questions from the members of the board.

The next Board of Directors meeting is to be held on April 17, 2024.
